

# Typical Mice Entry Points



The following table lays out the typical entry points a mice removal company will find during a home inspection, and the area of the home the entry point can be found.

<b>Entry Point</b>	<b>Area of Home</b>
Hydro electrical lines	<i>Side of home</i>
Weather stripping	<i>Garage/back door</i>
Chimney flashing	<i>Roof of home</i>
Brick soffit gap	<i>Upper perimeter of home</i>
Weeping brick	<i>Ground level perimeter of home</i>
Gable vents	<i>Upper area near roof</i>
Roof vents	<i>Roof of the home</i>
Windowsills	<i>All sides of home</i>
Basement windows	<i>Bottom side of the house</i>
Cracks in the foundation	<i>Bottom side of the house</i>
Roof soffit intersection	<i>Upper roofline</i>
Drip edge connection	<i>Roofline perimeter</i>
Wall/dryer vents	<i>All sides of home</i>
Cellar vents	<i>Usually under front porch</i>
Siding border-caps	<i>Brock siding connection corners</i>
Door trim	<i>Areas where doors exist</i>

Note: mice will enter a home through holes caused by other animals, or they will chew out a hole themselves. In either case, the result is usually an infestation and the need for professional removal and prevention services. <https://www.ontariowildliferemoval.ca/>
